



Students in Mr. Wenzel's grade 9 Technological Design class have been busy making skate-boards. Over the last few weeks students' one-of-a-kind skateboards have really taken form. The project focusses on product design and fabrication techniques, and emphasizes student innovation. It has led to a fantastic set of final projects that the students can use for years to come. Grade 10 Tech Design (TDJ2O) recently completed their architecture unit where they had to design a venue for the upcoming Rio 2016 Olympic Summer Games. Students utilized computer assisted design and drafting techniques to design their venue, and then had to use manufacturing techniques to create their architectural prototype. Students were asked to include a removable roof so that the inside of their venues could be displayed, and were also asked to design the main ecompetition.





Students in Grade 12 Tech Design (TDJ4M) competed with each other after their recently completed Solar Car unit where they had to design a solar car using acrylic, a solar cell and solar cell motor. Students had to take into account weight, sunlight and gearing when designing their car, and were required to test their vehicle before the competition. Lots was learned about environmental design, function and form when designing a vehicle prototype of their design. Overall, the designs of the cars were very effective on a successful race day.
